If we all can recognize and learn from our mishaps or accidents and make changes to prevent that from happening again that would be great and that would also show the club that you are serious about safety and safety of others around you.**

# Let's Race!!

Let's do some pylon racing at the field. We did this 6 years ago and it is a lot of fun. The planes are not real fast, easy to build and pretty cheap. You have the choice of flying either the Flite Test Bloody Wonder or Bloody Baron. The only difference between the two is the Bloody Baron has a rudder.

If you haven't made a Flite Test plane yet, they are easy to build using Dollar Tree foam board, a razor knife/ razor blades and hot glue. The planes are made from a couple of sheets of Dollar Tree foam board, \$1.25 each. The motors cost less than \$20 and use a 20 amp esc and 3 cell lipo batteries.

Here are the specifications for the builds, same as we used last time.

**Motor 2212 1400kv**

**Propeller 8x4e**

**Battery 3 cell 1800mah to 2200mah**

**Servos any 9g to 12g servo**

**ESC any 20 amp or more you want. System tests at approximately 190 watts.**

**Plans for both planes can be found at Flite Test site and on the internet under FT Bloody Baron or FT Bloody Wonder.**

**If there is enough interest we can have a couple of build nights at the church to help people get planes started.**
